The Life Recovery team is entering an exciting phase of development. We have a new dedicated premises in which to run our in-house Life Course and peer support activities. It's a fantastic space to relaunch our Life Course for the post Covid era and to expand the provision offered.

The **GROUP FACILITATOR (LIFE COURSE)** will be based at our offices in Bristol supporting clients through running the Life Course using the materials that have been developing at inHope. They will be involved in client focussed activities, helping those we work with to strengthen and sustain their recovery and become role models in their own community.

The successful candidate will be competent at teaching and group facilitation, having good interpersonal and communication skills, with a calm assurance to negotiate good outcomes in complex client settings. They will have a knowledge of recovery issues in addiction and mental health fields, including lived experience, and have the capacity to support positive change in people. They will have a sense of call and compassion to support people in recovery, and enable others to do so also. They will report to the Life Course Team Leader.
